63 New Zealand Jewish leaders representing over 25 organisations gathered in Auckland from around the country on Sunday 8 August for a full day of workshops, seminars, and a deep desire for increased collaboration.

Daniel Rosenbaum conceived the idea and pulled together a fantastic programme with support from the New Zealand Jewish Council (NZJC). The purpose of the conference was summed up by NZJC president, Stephen Goodman, in his introduction

“The only way we are going to continue and grow in a safe and secure society is for us to have sound, committed and capable Jewish leadership. Providing support for those currently in leadership roles and those able to move into these roles is the objective of this conference.”

Mr Goodman’s opening remarks were joined by welcome notes from Mary Kluk, President of the South African Jewish Board of Deputies and Vice President of the World Jewish Congress as well as Clive Lawton Chief Executive of the Commonwealth Jewish Council.

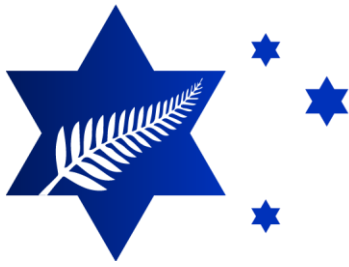
“We are a people of destiny, not a people of the past. Fix the future. Contribute to it” - Clive Lawton
